During this reporting period, NOAA charged 13 cases, settled 10 cases², and otherwise resolved 2 cases.

ALASKA

- 1. AK2000930; F/V America's Finest and F/V U.S. Intrepid Owner Fishermen's Finest, Inc. et al was charged under the Frank Lobiondo Coast Guard Authorization Act of 2018 with exceeding mothership processing caps of Flathead sole, Yellowfin sole, and Alaska plaice. A \$48,183 NOVA was issued, and the case settled for \$47,183.
- 2. AK2301745; M/V Phoenix Owner Phoenix Processor LP and Operator David Long were charged jointly and severally under the Magnuson-Stevens Fishery Conservation and Management Act (Magnuson-Stevens Act) with failing to submit check-in/check-out reports or have an operational VMS on board while operating a mothership in the Bering Sea. A \$5,000 NOVA was issued.

NORTHEAST

- 3. NE2202507 International Fisheries Trade Permit holder Merex Seafoods USA, Inc. was charged under the Magnuson-Stevens Act with importing species subject to the Seafood Import Monitoring Program ("SIMP") without submitting accurate and complete information at the time of entry and failing to maintain chain-of-custody records required under SIMP. A \$12,750 NOVA was issued.
- 4. NE2204267A; F/V Lucy Ella Owner/Operator Cory Leduc was charged under the Magnuson-Stevens Act with failing to report Atlantic bluefin tuna in a timely manner on five occasions and selling an Atlantic bluefin tuna to a person other than a permitted dealer. A \$22,500 NOVA was issued.
- 5. NE2204267B Restaurant Owner MacVane Tray Enterprises, Inc. and Principal Rattanak Tray were charged jointly and severally under the Magnuson-Stevens Act with first receiving an Atlantic bluefin tuna by way of purchase without the proper dealer permit. A \$6,500 NOVA was issued.
- 6. NE2300903; M/V The Three B's Owners/Operators John Bergantino and Carolyn Bergantino were charged jointly and severally under the Endangered Species Act and the Marine Mammal
